Crime Overview

This section looks at the crimes of public interest that have occurred on the Rugby Rural Central Safer Neighbourhood Team policing area. Below is a brief summary of some of the incidents that have been reported to us in the month of September:

Anti Social Behaviour – There have been 11 separate reports of ASB in the Rugby Rural Central area.

- 3rd September 2016-0162 – Thernmill Road, Long Lawford – Report that 2 youths have been seen riding around on a small motorbike.
- 3rd September 2016-0177 – Brandon Woods, Report that a family have been seen in the woods riding off road vehicles. Police attended and found vehicle used to get to the woods was not insured or taxed. Driver reported for summons
- 3rd September 2016-0208 – Teeswater Close, Long Lawford– Report that 2 youths have been seen riding around on a small motorbike.
- 4th September 2016-0174 – Chapel Street, Long Lawford - Report that a group of youths have been seen taking turns to ride around on a small off-road motorbike.
- 5th September 2016-0418 – Teeswater Close, Long Lawford– Report that 2 youths have been seen riding around on a small motorbike.
- 6th September 2016-0346 - Teeswater Close, Long Lawford– Report that 2 youths have been seen riding around on a small motorbike.
- 12th September 2016-0254 - Brandon Woods, Report that a family have been seen in the woods riding off road vehicles. Police attended and S59 warning issued.
- 18th September 2016-0207 - Brandon Woods, Report that group has been seen in the woods riding off road vehicles. Police attended and S59 warning issued.
- 21st September 2016-0358 - Brandon Woods, Report that group has been seen in the woods riding off road vehicles. Police attended and S59 warning issued.
- 23rd September 2016-0083 – Meadow Road, Wolston – Report that an unknown person has thrown a can of beer at the informants property. No damage caused.
- 24th September 2016-0353 – School Street, Long Lawford – Report that a motorbike was riding around at 100mph.

Burglaries (Dwelling) – There have been no reports of Burglary Dwellings in the Rugby Central area.

Burglaries (Non Dwelling) – There have been no reports of Burglary (Non Dwelling) in the Rugby Rural Central Area.

Criminal Damage – There have been no reports of Criminal Damage in the Rugby Rural Central Area.

Theft – There have been 2 reported thefts.

- 19th September 2016-0282 – Redhill Road, Long Lawford – Report that unknown persons have stolen an insecure pedal cycle from outside the informants property.
- 19th September 2016-0341 – Hillman Way, Ryton on Dunsmore – Report that an employee has stolen items whilst at work.

Vehicle Crime – There have been 12 separate reports of vehicle crime.

- 5th September 2016-0363 – Leamington Road, Ryton on Dunsmore – Report that an unknown male has been seen entering an insecure van and stolen tools.
- 6th September 2016-0059 – Kings Newnham Road, Church Lawford – Report that unknown person have removed part of the bodywork from a parked unattended vehicle. This was believed to be around midnight.
- 6th September 2016-0109 – Manor Estate, Wolston – Report that unknown persons have tried to steal a moped from the informant's property. Damaged caused to the bodywork.
- 7th September 2016-0160 – Leamington Road, Ryton on Dunsmore – Report that, unknown persons have stolen a white Ford Transit van.
- 13th September 2016-0227 – Freeboard Lane, Ryton on Dunsmore – Report that the informant had arranged to sell a vehicle with males. The unknown males stole the vehicle and an amount of cash. The other vehicle was then set alight on the B4453.
- 16th September 2016-0175 – Oxford Road, Ryton on Dunsmore – Report that unknown persons have stolen a white Ford Transit Van.
- 16th September 2016-0211 – Manor Estate, Wolston – Whilst the informants were working in Manor Estate, unknown persons have stolen a strimmer and hedge trimmer from the rear of a flatbed tipper van.
- 17th September 2016-0133 – Holly Drive, Ryton on Dunsmore – Report that unknown persons have stolen an Audi S5 in Black from the address without keys.
- 18th September 2016-0159 – Warwick Road, Wolston – Report that unknown persons have damaged a car sometime overnight.
- 21st September 2016-0150 – School Street, Wolston – Report that unknown persons have stolen a White Ford Transit Van. Items from the van were found in Craven Road Binley Woods.
- 23rd September 2016-0107 – A45, Ryton on Dunsmore – Report that unknown persons have stolen a JCB digger from a secure compound. Digger has been recovered.
- 25th September 2016-0078 – Little Lawford Lane, Little Lawford – Report that a caravan has been entered by unknown means.

Damage to a Property in Ryton on Dunsmore.

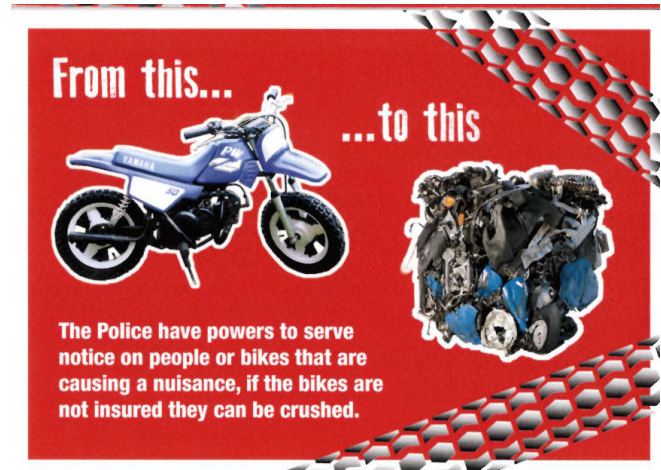

New Policing priorities have been set for the Rugby Rural Central Team at September's Community Forum. The two priorities set are;

Property marking event in Ryton on Dunsmore



PCSO Havelock held a property marking event outside the Co-op in Ryton on Dunsmore on Thursday 8th September 2016. PCSO Havelock was able to provide visitors with bike marking kits, property marking pens and purse bells as well as other items made available. He was also on hand to answer questions about crime trends in the area, and also able to speak about personal safety and advice to prevent you from becoming a victim.

Rural Team act on reports from the community.

On the 12th September during a targeted patrol in Brandon, PC Stamp and PCSO Havelock came across an off road bike being ridden in Brandon Woods without permission. The team were patrolling the area as it had been raised as a community priority due to ongoing ASB issues surrounding the use of off-road vehicles in Brandon Woods. The owner of the vehicle was issued with a section 59 notice and warned that if he is caught again his vehicle will be confiscated. Anti social behaviour caused by off road vehicles being driven in areas where the land owner has not given permission is a serious concern in rural areas and causes a nuisance to residents, frightens livestock and wildlife, damages crops and the environment. Warwickshire Police have an off road bike team that patrol areas where these problems occur and work closely with farmers and other community groups to stop this problem.





Later on the day on the 12th September the same rural officers were patrolling Clayhill lane in Long Lawford and seized 2 vehicles one of which was being driven with no insurance and the second vehicle was seized due to having an inappropriate licence; the same people from this second vehicle also had fishing rods seized from within the vehicle as Officers suspected that they were about to poach in the nearby ford without having the necessary Rod Licences.

Car seized for No TAX

On 13th September whilst on mobile patrol in Brandon PC Stamp and PCSO Havelock were conducting pro active checks on vehicles in the area, whilst doing so they saw a car travelling along Avondale in Brandon; checks showed both TAX and MOT expired in January 2016; The car was stopped and was seized.



Section 59 issued in Brandon Woods

On the 18th September 2016 PC Stamp was again on targeted mobile patrol at Bandon Woods when he stopped and spoke to a male enjoying a day out in the Woods with his family using Quad Bikes and monkey Bikes. The male was advised that the Woods is not a suitable place for using these vehicles, as it isn't safe nor is it legal. The male was issued a Section 59 Notice and warned if he was caught acting in the same manner again within 12 months he and his family can have their vehicles seized and crushed.

On Wednesday 21st September 2016 PC Stamp was again on patrol in the area of Brandon Woods when he caught a male with his 6 year old son on a monkey Bike within the Woods, the Male was given the same advise and information as the persons previously caught riding/using the vehicles in the Woods and another Section 59 was issued.

Van owner summonsed to court for numerous motoring offences.



On the 22nd September PC Stamp and PCSO Havelock were on patrol in the Brandon are when they conducted a stop check of a vehicle. Officers couldn't believe their eyes when they established the numerous offences within the car, broken near side wing mirror, cracked front windscreen, expired tax, 3 bald tyres' and then to top it off the driver was giving a lift home to one of his fellow colleagues' in the rear of the vehicle, the man was laying down in the rear amongst all the days tools including sharp screwdrivers, hammers and drills to name but a few. The driver has been summonsed to court relating to this.

PCSO's give van owners crime advice at Golf Club

PCSO Cawte and PCSO Havelock attended Brandon Golf club on Friday 23rd September 2016, to give van owners advice regarding vehicle crime. The area had suffered from trade vehicles being entered whilst working on properties in the Rugby Rural Central Area.
