2017 started well when at our January meeting the speaker, Patricia Cornwell, became Mrs. Victor Bruce who was an aviator and racing driver at a time when not many women took part in these pursuits. She said she first realised how exhilarating she found speed when she was 6 years old and her pony bolted. When she was 15 she borrowed her brother's motor bike and side car and after being stopped by a policeman was taken to court and fined six shillings and banned from driving until she was 16. She had numerous fines for speeding and on one occasion was caught speeding on three consecutive days. She met her husband at a motor car rally and together took part in the 1927 Monte Carlo rally when she drove 1700 miles without sleep and came 6th overall and won the Coupe de Dames for women's class. On another occasion, she drove from London through Europe and planted a Union Jack 250 miles north of the Arctic Circle which was a record and this remained unbroken until the 21st century. A remarkable lady and an excellent speaker.
