ACWW

Gillian Crisp who is a Federation Trustee and a member of ACWW (Associated Country Women of the World), came to our February meeting to tell us more about the work of ACWW. There is a close association between the W.I. and ACWW and our Federation contribute to them. Their aim is to improve the lives of women and children by giving them the means to earn some money. This could be by providing a cow, a pair of rabbits which the women look after and sell the milk, meat and can then give the offspring to other women. By doing this the women may then be able to afford to let the children stop working in the fields and attend school. ACWW have also helped to provide drilling wells and clean water to improve the health of poor communities. They do not receive any government funding and one way they raise money is to collect broken jewellery, watches, mobile phones, cameras, gadgets, foreign currency and used stamps which they sell. How many of us have bits of jewellery that is broken, or we do not use, so if you would like to help this worthwhile cause then give it to a W.I. member who will make sure it is forwarded to the ACWW.
