Parry originally wrote the music for the 'Fight for Right Movement' in 1916. He withdrew their right to use it when he became uncomfortable with their views. Being a supporter of the National Union of Women's Suffrage Association, he was only too pleased to let them use his music with Jerusalem for their campaigns when asked. The WI were very much a part of this movement. He died in 1918 but willed the copyright of the music to the WI when ALL women over 21 got the vote which happened in 1928. Hence the reason why we sing Jerusalem.
