We, the Neighbourhood Plan Co-Ordination Team, made up of local volunteers, have produced this survey for our community. Using results from our 'Mood Cards' and other comments that have been collected from members of our community via our public meetings and event stands, the survey asks further questions about the issues that are most common in our neighbourhood.

The results from the Survey will be vital to our evidence base which forms the foundations of our Neighbourhood Development Plan which will remain in effect, alongside Rugby Borough Councils Local Plan, until 2031. We would like every resident above 16 years of age, to complete one each - two copies are included in this envelope. You can download additional copies online or request more by calling or texting the number at the bottom of this page. Please also encourage your fellow residents to complete and return it.

A Neighbourhood Plan is a significant material planning consideration, carrying great weight in planning decisions.

"Neighbourhood planning gives communities direct power to develop a shared vision for their neighbourhood and shape the development and growth of their local area. They are able to choose where they want new homes, shops and offices to be built, have their say on what those new buildings should look like and what infrastructure should be provided, and grant planning permission for the new buildings they want to see go ahead."

A Neighbourhood Plan isn't about stopping growth, but is about ensuring that we take the opportunity to have *proportionate*, *sympathetic and sustainable organic* growth that fulfils our community needs.
